

engraved a heart, pierced by two arrows, with the inscription: "I live and dy in loyaltye," a motto recently adopted by some members of the family in place of the older, but meaningless, motto: "A quo trepidabo?" On the other side, above an eye from which are falling three tears, is the inscription: "Quis temperit a lacrymis. January 30, 1648." On one side of the interior is an embossed portrait of Charles, while on the other is written: "Prepared be to follow me. C.R." It may be worth noticing that the will of John Goodacre, of Sapcote, dated 28th May, 1728, is sealed with a device, evidently adopted from this relic, being a heart pierced with two arrows, beneath an eye. A silver heart, precisely similar to the above, was exhibited in London at the recent Stuart Exhibition.
