

Even so, it remains understudied by urban historians of the pre-modern period. This book aims to fill some of this gap, containing twelve studies of generations in late medieval and early modern European towns, ranging from the Mediterranean to the Nordic countries, with a time-span from the fourteenth to the early nineteenth century. Dealing with topics such as succession and inheritance, and family consciousness, as well as relations and conflicts within and between generations. the articles demonstrate the importance and potential of generational studies on pre-modern towns. This book will appeal to anyone with an interest in urban social and cultural history, or legal and family history in the medieval and early modern times.

**Finn-Einar Eliassen** is Professor of History at Vestfold University College, Norway. **Katalin Szende** is Associate Professor in the Department of Medieval Studies at the Central European University, Budapest, Hungary. They are both members of the International Commission for the History of Towns.
